COVID UPDATE



As most of you are aware the Government has this week suspended most of the COVID TRAFFIC LIGHT FRAMEWORK and the restrictions that we have observed over the last almost twelve months. We are now striving to return back to the freedoms we enjoyed before 25th March 2020.

Communications have been received from both the NZ Catholic Bishops' Conference and Cardinal John regarding the easing of the restrictions in NZ and Wellington.

The NZCBC stated that it is important to remember the lifting of restrictions does not remove the risk of infections from COVID or other viruses. They urge communities and individuals to be prudent in retaining particular restriction in the interests of continuing to protect the most vulnerable.

Cardinal John's letter advised that the following practices previously suspended may be resumed.

- Communion under both kinds
- Communion on the tongue
- Contact at Sign of Peace
- Masks are no longer mandated
- Ministers distributing Communion should wear a mask while undertaking the ministry
- Holy water is available at the church door
- NOTE: THE DISPENSATION FROM THE SUNDAY OBLIGATION TO ATTEND EUCHARIST IS NOW REMOVED. People whose health might be endangered by attendance or for whom it may be physically difficult are reminded that they can make decision attending Mass based on their own safety and ability.

The removal of some restrictions especially around Communion under both kinds was unexpected by the Parish Council. Having reviewed the letters received the Parish Council has decided that to provide a safe and welcoming environment at Sunday Mass for all, and especially those who have felt hesitant about returning, and to provide a time

From this weekend (11/12th September) the following will apply at Our Lady of the Valleys Parish

- Holy water will be available at the doors of both churches.
- Contact at the Sign of Peace will be restored.
- Masks will no longer be required when attending services in the Church.
- Ministers distributing Holy Communion, because of the close contact involved, are asked to wear a mask while undertaking the ministry.
- Seating in alternative rows will be retained in the meantime to provide a safe environment for those who feel hesitant around returning to Sunday Eucharist. (This will be reviewed with the intention to remove it from 17th October)

Communion will be provided under the form of Hosts only to allow time to fill vacant places on the roster to provide the number of ministers required for the ministry (It is intended to return to Communion under both kinds by 17th October)

The Parish Council is aware that some people may feel vulnerable with the easing of these requirements. If anyone wants to maintain personal restrictions (such as mask wearing etc) please feel free to do so. Masks will continue to be available in the foyer for those who want them. Other parishioners are asked to be understanding of those who still be vulnerable or hesitant around the easing of restrictions. We want to be a place where all parishioners feel both safe and welcomed.

While the Parish Council would like to return everything back to normal (the way it was) we hope that parishioners will appreciate the planned approach they have adopted to encourage those who are hesitant about returning and the supply personnel resourcing. They ask your patience and understanding as we move through this period of transition.

SUPPORT PALLIATIVE CARE



NZ Catholics are being urged to support the underfunded hospice and palliative care services bv donating, volunteering in hospice shops and asking their members of Parliament and the Government to make palliative care a priority. Bishop of Auckland Steve Lowe, Secretary of the NZCBC, says hospices

provide a free service to 20,000 palliative care patients and their whanau each year, but have to fundraise almost half the \$176 million cost. Bishop Steve says: "When the public was asked at the 2020 election to support the euthanasia legislation - dubbed the End of Life Choice law - they were led to believe palliative care would be a priority choice. Instead, hospice funding has been virtually capped at a time of high inflation"
