Speakers in OLOG church (Des)

Des and a few other parishioners have showed concern/complained over the sound system in the OLOG church.

This is currently being looked at – currently waiting for a sound technician to come and look at the sound systems in the church.

Other possibilities including changing the acoustics of the church a possibility to improve the sound systems? Difference of sound systems in St Francis Xavier church and Our Lady of Grace is vastly different.

Father mentions that the setup of the churches also impacts the sound systems – SFX is narrow and long whilst OLOG is wide and short. Also, not much that we can do regarding the acoustics of the church at this moment in time.

Once sound system is fixed – is there a possibility to work with parishioners to test the sound systems?

Father will be in contact once the sound systems are fixed.

Individual special collections (Margaret)

Margaret asks whether the amounts of the Individual special collections (eg: Peter's Pence) could be included in the Financial reports and if they could be advertised more in the bulletins.

Jovena, Parish Secretary, explains that though it is possible to give a report and advertise the special collections – they are not scheduled regularly and occur at random; never a set time/date each time.

Include in the bulletin about the special collection of that week but question of whether we are wanting to ask more of our parishioners, on top of their automatic payments, is a concern.

Kia ora koutou, greetings to everyone.

This year has been an opportunity to reflect on all the people in our Parish and all the volunteers that help make things happen. Yet again we have continued to push through the COVID-19 pandemic, and respond accordingly. Diligently, many of our volunteers continued to work through these times - often, this included adjusting the way they worked or exploring other ways of continuing connection within the Parish groups. This shows the true strength of the Holy Spirit in action, dedication and resilience. If you would like to become more involved in our Parish, please get in touch - there are lots of opportunities to take part, and you will be welcomed with open arms!

Our response to COVID-19 meant that as a Council, we needed to make sure we kept people safe. We did this by listening to Ministry of Health guidelines as well as advice from Cardinal John. Different 'Traffic Light' settings across the country meant different things in the way we interacted with each other. Sometimes, this meant not singing, closing church pews to spread people out, not lining up for the Eucharist, not passing the collection baskets around, and sometimes sadly, delivering Mass online. We have learnt to adjust to change, and things will continue changing in the future. We just need to make sure we are prepared and ready to respond in order to keep our people safe and our Parish connected.

We have noticed a significant drop off in numbers attending Mass. We know there are many reasons for this but we would love to welcome everyone back. Our lives get busy, there are workplace staff shortages across the country, there are many illnesses going around, and people have other commitments. In my own life, these are all very common concerns - Including weekend kid's sports activities. As a Council, we do hope to offer church spaces and Masses that help people pause for a moment, be able to reflect and spend time with God. Despite the challenges, it's also an opportunity to be connected to others through our shared faith. There are many groups within the Parish to belong to, where you will benefit from meeting new people, and they will also benefit from your presence. Likewise if you know of anyone you think would like to join your group, invite them along - they may be waiting for that invitation.

Over the past few months, our Parish was invited by the Archdiocese of Wellington and Pope Francis, to engage in a Synod discernment process. This was about connecting

with others in the Parish and taking time to pray together and collaborate on the direction of the Church. We were provided with a series of reflective questions to respond to. The responses were collected and submitted to the Archdiocese of Wellington. The Synod Team then conducted a synthesis of common themes and submitted it to the NZ Catholic Bishops' Conference. From there, the submission will make its way to Rome. I was lucky to attend an Archdiocesan Synod Gathering which highlighted themes that had emerged. During the gathering we also participated in further discernment about the themes. It was a really awakening opportunity personally. I realised there were some really important points and concerns people throughout our Diocese had, and that we were certainly beginning to embark on a time of change for the Church. Looking ahead, we hope to hold a Parish Council goal setting day. This will include revising our strategic direction, reflecting on our pandemic response, responding to the Synod findings, and collaborating on our dreams for the Parish. Liturgy Committee Report

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

The Liturgy Committee meets every fourth Thursday of the month in St. Francis Xavier or Our Lady of Grace Meeting Rooms. Along with Father



Tony Kearns, our Parish Priest, we plan for the special feast days and celebrations that are an integral part of the calendar year of the Catholic Church in New Zealand.

This past year has been very challenging and uncertain as we experienced the wide effects of COVID - 19 in our community. We were guided by the recommendations of Cardinal John in our response to the pandemic. The Parish Council and the Liturgy Committee discussed and implemented our action plan for Our Lady of the Valleys. As a result, our meetings were suspended between August and September. A booking in system was implemented, which required parishioners to book in to attend Masses with a capped attendance to ensure the safety of attendees. The water fonts in the foyer were removed, the Offertory Procession and money collection were suspended, every 2nd row was left vacant, and Father Tony and the Eucharistic Minister brought Communion to parishioners in our seats.

As we moved up and down restriction levels these guidelines were amended. The offertory Procession and collection of money have now been reinstated. Our choirs have very recently started to play and sing, but we all must continue to wear our masks. Our roster for the Readers and Leaders is also being used. The Living Waters Café and Children's Liturgy are due to start up again, but as I write this there is some uncertainty about this as we have a surge in numbers of people in the community who are affected by this virus.

The main Liturgical Events during the year are Easter, Pentecost and Easter. This year we have been able to celebrate these special celebrations. Those who attended appreciated the reflective atmosphere that was created because our focus was directed to the significant symbolism that are a feature of each of these celebrations. The towels that were placed on the ground on Holy Thursday evening was very poignant as a reminder of Jesus who washed the feet of his Apostles. Also, Christmas when Father Tony processed in carrying Baby Jesus who was carefully placed in the manger alongside Mary and Joseph. These are just two examples, and they take place every year, but this year we intently watched what was being enacted in the sanctuary, as our attention was not diverted by our singing. We even noticed the reverent manner that the towels were collected.

The Sacramental Programme has also gone ahead as planned. Archbishop Paul Martin visited our parish for the first time to Confirm our children on 3rd July. This was a wonderful celebration for the families involved and the parish, as we gathered to celebrate the Eucharist, the Sacrament of Confirmation and to support these children on their continuing faith journey.

From Friday 22nd July until Monday 25th July, Our Lady of the Valleys Parish hosted the icon Te Ara A Maria – Mary's Way. Various community groups and individuals came

together to celebrate Mary and the special place she holds in our lives. The icon travelled to St. Francis Xavier's Church in Stokes Valley, Our Lady of Grace Church in Heretaunga, St. Patrick's College in Silverstream and St. Brendan's School, before the icon was transported over the hill to the Wairarapa. Community groups were also invited from St. Joseph's Parish in Upper Hutt to pray, reflect and sing to Mary the Mother of Jesus.

After experiencing lock downs and not being able to attend weekly Sunday Masses, parishioners have a renewed appreciation of coming together as community to pray and celebrate the Eucharist.

The Liturgy Committee seeks the assistance from our fellow parishioners to take on the many roles and ministries within the parish. These include Sacristans, Greeters, Leaders, Readers, Writers of Prayers of the Faithful, Children's Liturgy Leaders, Altar Servers, Extra-ordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, music groups and choirs, etc.

Our Lady of the Valleys Liturgy Committee is a very small group of committed parishioners, who would like to take this opportunity to thank our fellow parishioners for their generous support that we receive from those who share their talents, time and treasures for our Liturgical Celebrations. We would welcome anyone who would like to join us in planning and delivering these important Liturgical Celebrations, or the other parish ministries who also serve our parish.

Two members of the committee resigned during the last 12 months, John Balao and Pat Krippner. These people were thanked for their input into the running of the parish finances.

We continue to manage the finances of the Parish and also the property portfolio which involves the land and buildings that are owned by the Parish. We have recently finalised the review of the lease of the land to the Koranui Marae, and have on going commitments to the repairs and maintenance of the various buildings owned by the Parish.

This year has been somewhat challenging, with the continuation of the COVID-19 restrictions. We are pleased that the parishioners, who have automatic payments to the parish have continued to support us with their payments and would continue to encourage other parishioners who have yet to instigate automatic payments, to do so.

St Brendan's School

Since the 2021 St Brendan's Annual Report to the Parish, our school and community have continued to feel the ripple effects of the global pandemic. We have operated at Alert Levels 4, 3 and 2 and at the Red and Orange settings of the Covid Protection Framework. These have been unprecedented times where we have had to introduce a range of protocols and procedures to support the health and wellbeing of our school community. Some things have been cancelled, some postponed, many have been modified and often we have had several plans prepared for multiple eventualities. We have drawn strength from our faith, the support of our community and our team's professional positivity.

During 2021 we developed a new three year strategic plan:



School Production - Searching for Grace

Our St Brendan's 2021 production was entitled, "Searching for Grace". This was written by a group of Navigator students with the support of Cassandra Tse and James Cain:

In a small town on the island of Ake Ake, our Heroes Pedro and Mikayla notice something odd is happening. As they go about their day, they find their island is sinking and things are disappearing. Determined to find a solution, Mikayla and Pedro embark upon a daring adventure, accompanied by their furry friends. Will they complete their mission and save their island, or will the curse demolish the whole island before they can save it?

With St Brendan as a main character and the GRACE values (Gospel, Respect, Aspire, Compassion, Explore) a key part of the mission, the 2021 production was a visible sign of Catholic character and faith in action.

Unfortunately COVID Alert levels changed on the day of the dress rehearsal! A live audience was unable to appreciate the 2021 production, instead the performance was filmed and the recording shared with our community.

The production also launched a new school song, 'The St Brendan's Way':

- Celebration of Laudato Si' Week, Week of Prayer for Christian Unity and Suzanne Aubert's Birthday.
- Connecting with Catholic Women's League and the monthly Community Cafe catch ups.
- Strengthening links with our neighbouring, and other, Catholic schools.
