THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL

The story illustrates the power of faith. Have you noticed that when you believe in someone, or something, you can do things that would not be possible when you are full of doubts? Recall moments when your faith gave you strength and courage? Name for yourself the different kinds of

gave you strength and courage? Name for yourself the different kinds of faith that had this effect: belief in yourself, trust in another, faith in God.

When Jesus got into the boat the winds ceased. Who has been a Jesus person for you and helped to calm a storm that frightened you or made you anxious?

The experience of Peter gives encouragement to us when we waver in our trust and belief in God. In his doubt and fear Jesus reached out to him. Who has reached out a helping hand to you when you felt you were sinking?

The story ends with a profession of faith in Jesus as the Son of God. Have you had experiences of being rescued from some hazard or danger: experiences which deepened your faith in the presence and compassion of God for you?

WHY WE DO THE THINGS WE DO?

Why do we take up collections each Sunday?

The simplest answer is that, as with any organisation, it costs money to run the Church: schools, hospitals, maintenance,

wages, and projects for the spread of the Gospel and caring for those-inneeds, crisis appeals in the wider community...

But the Church is more than an organisation. It is a community with a familial character and operates as such. There are no membership fees. No one is excluded from church services because they cannot pay. Rather, Catholics are asked to 'pitch in' according to their means. Normally the Sunday collection is devoted to the living costs of the priest and the presbytery, the various Church ministries and building projects. A second collection is sometimes included for a special appeal.

'If we work together, we can succeed.' Aubert




including Dennis O'Grady, Nadine Herrick, and Gabrielle Worthington. We pray also for those whose anniversaries occur around this time. May they rest in peace.
