THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL

The Eucharist is essentially and of its very nature a community action in which every person present is expected to be an active participant We are here, on the one hand, recalling what makes us Christians in the first place – our identification with the life,



suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus And that identification with Jesus is expressed not through a one-to-one relationship with him but in a community relationship with him present in all those who call themselves Christian We relate to him through his Risen Body, which is the whole community bearing his name There is no place in Christianity for individualism It is a horizontal faith: we go to God with and through those around us.

Every Lord's Day we come together as that Body, as a community, to say thanks to him and hence the name 'Eucharist' which means 'thanks' It is regrettable, then, if we are only in church to 'keep the Third Commandment' on a purely private, individual, devotional basis With that mentality, it will not be surprising if we think it does not matter if we are late or leave early Because, with that mentality, 'going to Mass' is a private affair for me and all the others who 'happen' to be there, too.

Some even resent that there is too much going on They wonder why they cannot be 'left in peace to say their prayers' It is true some Mass celebrations can be overactive or over-intrusive but, on the other hand, it is not a time for contemplative prayer. One can do that much better at home The whole point of being at Mass is to celebrate together with one's fellow-Christians as a community of the disciples of Jesus.

WHY WE DO THE THINGS WE DO? Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ.

This feast (*Corpus Christi* in the Latin) focuses on the Eucharist as a symbol and sacrament of unity. Although we celebrate the Eucharist every Sunday, today we pause to give special consideration to the Bread of Life nourishing our lives. When we break bread and share the one cup we recall that sacred meal between Christ and his disciples just before he sacrificed his life on the cross. We know that, like those disciples, Christ's death and resurrection has bonded us in a love relationship. For this reason, the Eucharist is never a private affair but always a call to unity. As you receive communion today, be conscious not only of Christ's presence in the Eucharistic host, but his presence in those who are receiving with sea

Why do we have a Prayer of the Faithful?

In these prayers (also called the General Intercessions) the congregation intercedes for all humanity. We pray that the Church will be a life-giving sign of salvation to the world. We pray for Church leaders and public authorities, for those oppressed by various needs, and for all people. In making these petitions we are conscious that the Church exists for others rather than simply for its own sake. United at the Eucharistic table as the body of Christ, we are powerfully equipped to reach out as a loving and liberating force in the world.


THE VINCENTIAN FOUNDATION FOR THE ELDERLY




