THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL

small gesture of friendship, a kind look, a ready ear, a good deed, in the knowledge that, in the Spirit of Jesus, these can become, for those who receive them, rich seeds of hope.'

Some people bless themselves – make the Sign of the Cross – when they pass a church. What does it mean? Perhaps only God knows. It is a prayer, an invocation, a visible act of faith, a public yet personal gesture as you pass 'God's house'. It is a reminder of how precious and universal that gesture is: to bless yourself in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. You see people blessing themselves in all sorts of situations: absentmindedly on the way into church; solemnly at the end of Mass; in thankful delight, as with sports people; poignantly, in the case of mourners at a grave. In extreme sickness, when the brain can no longer form words and the only way we can turn to God may be with our feeble fingers, forming a cross. This sign can grow hurried and thoughtless through custom, but in moments of crisis and deep emotion, there are few gestures as rich in meaning as blessing ourselves.

WHY WE DO THE THINGS WE DO?

It appears that Peter and Paul did not always get on too well together. Isn't it odd to celebrate the two of them in the one feast?

WHY we DO the THINGS we DO?

One or two differences of strategy would not mean that they were always at odds with one another. They were united in their dedication to Christ and the courageous witness of martyrdom. Another reason for a joint celebration is to present them as the founding fathers of the church in Rome, then the capital of the world. Christians saw them as replacing Romulus and Remus, the traditional founders of Rome

Could you please explain why Peter was given first placing among the early Church?

In the Catholic tradition the Pope, the Bishop of Rome, is considered to be the successor of St Peter. According to scripture and Church tradition Peter held a prime position of leadership among the twelve apostles.

The word 'pope' comes from the Latin papa as a translation of the Greek papas which means 'father'. Peter was the bishop of Rome and leader or 'father' of the community and can fairly be called the first 'pope' even though the term was not used in his own time but emerged later.

Catholics look to the Pope is a foundational sign of unity within the Church and guardian of the faith which has been handed down through the ages.


