THROUGH THE LENS OF THE GOSPEL

Faith can move mountains... well it can certainly get us moving. Recall a time when you were full of self-doubt, skepticism about a project, or lacking trust in God. What was that like? Contrast this with times when

you believed in yourself, or in the value of a project you had undertaken, or when your faith and trust in God was strong. What kind of faith have you found enriched your life?

Faith is like a mustard seed, small, and sometimes we may be tempted to wait till our faith grows. Part of the message in the gospel is to use the faith we have, even though it may be small. That is how we grow in belief in ourselves and in God's presence in our lives. Does your experience back up this?

It is nice when what we do is recognised and acknowledged, but the desire for recognition leaves us vulnerable. It is not always forthcoming. It can be helpful if our main motivation in doing something is the value of the action itself. Have you experienced this?

This is particularly true when it comes to love. Love is a free gift. What is given lovingly is not given because of a claim. What is your experience of the freedom of love given and received?

WHY WE DO THE THINGS WE DO?

Does a person receive more grace by taking Holy Communion from the chalice as well as from the host?

The short answer is 'No'. Even a tiny particle of the sacred host is a total meeting with the Lord who is the Bread of Life.



However, for better liturgy we should be moving towards the availability of the chalice to all who receive. It is not a question of receiving more grace but a more complete fulfilment of the Lord's invitation at the last supper- to eat this bread and drink this cup.

- 1. The words of the Eucharistic Prayer say "take this Chalice, and drink from it
- 2. Communion is only distributed by Priests and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion
- 3. Taking a 'self help' action to the Blood of Christ is not correct
- 4. It is a Priest who can intinc the bread into the blood and offer to communicants the Body and Blood of Christ but the blood could not be placed in the hand and needed to be administered on the tongue. However, we are not supposed to give Communion on the tongue today for health and safety reasons.

COMMUNION UNDER BOTH KINDS TO RESUME THIS SUMMER

Following thoughtful discussion between Fr Maleko and the Parish Pastoral Council, and in light of the recent parish survey (which showed a 50/50 split), we're pleased to share that Communion under both kinds—bread and wine—will resume starting the weekend of 6–7 December. Taking a 'self help' action to the Blood of Christ is not correct. This decision reflects our commitment to inclusivity and spiritual nourishment while respecting the diverse views within our community. The Parish Pastoral Council will review this arrangement again at Easter next year. Thank you to everyone who took part in the survey and helped quide this decision.

PLEASE REMEMBER IN PRAYER all who are sick and unwell, and those who are lonely. We pray also for those who have died recently especially, Maria Taguba Balao, Ann Wilson, and

Archbishop Novatus Rugambwa, and for those whose anniversaries occur around this time.


