Message of Gratitude and Farewell

As you are aware this is my last weekend with you as Parish Priest of Our Lady of the Valleys Parish. I leave later this week to take up my new appointment, not that far away, as the Parish Priest of St Joseph's Parish in Upper Hutt.

I remember arriving in February 2016 and being warmly welcomed into this parish family and looking forward to spending years exploring and celebrating together the shared journey we were on.

Preparing to leave is a time to reflect; to reflect on the ones we love and who love us, reflect on times shared over the past nine years, the ups and downs, the joys and hopes, the griefs and anguishes that are ours as human beings. In the midst of this it is also a time to reflect how we have been blessed by the one whose entry into human history we are proclaim – Christ himself.

These events were marked on 26th to 28th February 2021 and 13th June 2021 due to a COVID lockdown partway through the weekend celebration on Saturday February 27th.

It is sometimes easier to see the face of the Christ-child in these 'large' events of the past years, but other memories come as well – the delight of a child yelling a 'hello Father Tony' in the supermarket aisle, the deep sense of faith felt as I have been welcomed into so many of your homes and hearts while out visiting, the helping hand of Jesus the worker as tasks both small and great are undertaken by people who see a need and quietly work away to share of their time and talents.

These for me have been a real sign of the significance of Emmanuel (God-with-us) taking root in our parish family. May each of you experience anew the blessings of the God who walks with each of us on our Emmaus journey of faith.

I know that I will always be grateful for the years that I was here in Our Lady of the Valleys and I will endeavour in my ministry ahead to share something of the love that you have demonstrated to me in our time together.
